Santa Fe Fun Fest May 22, 2011

The 2011 Santa Fe Skate Fest will be conducted under the rules of US Figure Skating as set forth in the 2010-11 Official US Figure Skating Rule Book. This competition will be judged using the **IJS system for Juvenile through Senior short and long events and some Adult Freeskating events** and **6.0 system of judging for all other events**. All competitors skating in IJS events need to submit the PROGRAM CONTENT FORM along with their competition entry form. **This form must be filled out online at www.usfigureskating.org** and is found in USFS member's only section <https://www.usfsaonline.org/Elements/CompProfile.asp>. The **deadline to submit the form is the entry deadline. Forms will not be accepted after the deadline**. Please expect that additional time will be needed by accounting to process & post IJS event results. For information on the Skate Fest and Fun Fest, including schedules, visit the Santa Fe Skating Club's web-site at www.SantaFeSkatingClub.org.

ELIGIBILITY

This competition is open to all eligible members of US Figure Skating. Competition level is the highest **free skating test** passed as of the entry deadline. Skaters may skate at one level higher than tested for any event; it is not required to skate up for all events entered. Skaters who have not previously tested may also move up one level and compete at the pre-preliminary / pre-bronze level. Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile entries will be grouped by age. Juvenile and higher will be grouped as set forth in the 2010-11 Rulebook. Initial skating order will be determined by random draw. All competitors must comply with US Figure Skating requirements relating to tests and eligibility.

FACILITIES

All events will be skated on one ice surface at the Genoveva Chavez Community Center (GCCC), located at 3221 Rodeo Road, Santa Fe, N.M. 87508. Phone 505/955-4000 (Information) or 505/955-4033 (skate shop). The ice surface is an indoor surface, standard NHL rink, 85 x 200 feet with rounded corners. The snack bar, along with other facility amenities, will be open during the competition.

ENTRIES

Entry and practice ice fees must accompany the completed approved entry application. Incomplete entries may warrant a collect telephone call to the entrant, and are not accepted until complete

*NOTE: If a Skate Fest skater is participating in **single events and has paid the first event fee of \$85.00**, then the cost for the starred (*) events will be charged as additional events. FunFest non-test entrants who choose to participate at test level in some Skate Fest artistic or duet events may pay for these events at the Skate Fest 'additional' event rate, rather than 'first' event rate.

The Competition Committee reserves the right to limit the entries for each event or to cancel an entire event due to time constraints. Entries will be processed on a "First Come, First Served" basis. Returned or stop-payment checks are subject to a \$30

charge for each check. A skater will not be allowed to skate until all fees, including the \$30 returned check charge, have been paid in full.

All entries must be postmarked no later than April 1, 2011. Please use the U.S. Postal Service; **we will not accept entries that require signature for delivery.** Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee, and will be assessed a \$30 late fee. Any change after the close of entries will include the late fee. Incomplete applications are not considered entries until complete and may warrant a collect telephone call from the Competition Committee to obtain needed information. Two entries in an event will constitute a competition. Solo Dance and Couples Dance may be flighted due to time limitations. No entry fee will be refunded after **April 1, 2011** unless the competition is not held; no other reasons will apply. A processing fee of \$20 will be assessed on all refunds unless the event is not held. If there is only one entrant in an event, the event may be combined with a similar event or the skater may choose to do an Exhibition, a Critique, or Skate against the Book without refund or have the event cancelled with refund. The Referee must know the skater's choice at least 2 weeks prior to May 21st.

LIABILITY

US Figure Skating and the clubs or organizers of competitions undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skaters or officials. As a condition of, and in consideration of the acceptance of their entries or participation therein, all entrants, their parents and guardians and officials shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks of injury to their person or property resulting from, caused by or connected with the conduct and management of the competition, and to waive and release any and all claim which they may have against any officials, the US Figure Skating, the club hosting the competitions, against its officers, and the hosting facility (GCCC), and their entries shall be accepted only on such condition.

REGISTRATION

The registration desk will be located in the entrance lobby of the GCCC and will be open at 3:00pm on Friday May 20, 2011, and about 7:00am Saturday and Sunday, until competition-related activities for the day are finished. All entrants should check in when first arriving at the GCCC and confirm their allotted event times. **Skater, Coach, Officials, Volunteers and one Chaperone will get a credential at check-in. Anyone over 12 years without a credential will be charged a \$2.00 Spectator Fee per day.** Entrants will need to turn in music for each of their events at time of check-in. Failure to do so could result in a competitor being ineligible to compete. Please be prepared to provide a telephone number where you (skater) can be reached during the competition in case of schedule changes outside the normal **45 minute pre-arrival period** due to a competition schedule change.

PRACTICE ICE

Practice Ice will be available on Friday, May 20, 2011, but may be scheduled on another day or time depending on your competition schedule. The non-refundable charge for each pre-arranged 30 minute session (fill out practice ice form) will be \$15.00. Each competitor who requests practice ice with entry will be guaranteed at least one session. Additional Practice Ice will be available throughout the competition on a first come, first served basis at a cost of \$15.00 per 30 minute session. You may sign up for any additional practice ice that is available at the Registration Desk located in the entrance lobby of the GCCC. Once practice ice has been scheduled, **NO CHANGES WILL BE MADE BY THE PRACTICE ICE COMMITTEE TO THE PRACTICE ICE SCHEDULE**, beyond assignment of additional practice, when space is available. We will do everything we can to provide adequate ice, but be aware that we have only one ice surface. Practice Ice is limited to the day before the competition, and early morning/evening hours (as early as 5:00am and as late as 11:00pm). Skaters' practice times are assigned based on skating level and event types entered; this is a safety consideration. FunFest skaters will be assigned practice ice on Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning, as early as 6:00 a.m. **Skaters' music will not be played on practice ice.**

MUSIC

Competitors must provide their own music. **ONLY CD-Rs will be accepted –no tapes or CD-W.** Each CD may only have one track on it. All music must be plainly marked with competitor's name and event and must be turned in at the time of registration. A backup must be readily available. A CD player will be available at the registration desk to make sure the disk works. It is the skater's responsibility to ensure that CD's will play properly. CD's may be picked up after the conclusion of each event. The Music Committee will take reasonable precautions to safeguard music; however, the Committee is not responsible for accidental damage.

AWARDS

Awards will be presented as near as possible to the conclusion of each event. Check the Official Bulletin Board for schedule of times. Medals will be awarded to the top four (4) places in each event Pre-Preliminary and above. Medals will be awarded to all Fun Fest placements.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Immediately after the awards presentations, professional photographs will be available for purchase. Spectators will be allowed to take photographs away from the ice surface, but are reminded that **flash photography is dangerous to the skaters while they are performing and will not be allowed inside the arena.**

VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHY/MEDAL ENGRAVING

Professional video taping and photography by *Local Motion Productions* will be available for purchase. Note: Personal photos may not be taken at the Local Motion backdrop/awards stand. Medal engraving will also be available on site - times of operation will be posted.

OFFICIAL BULLETIN BOARD

An Official Bulletin Board will be maintained at the arena. The Official Schedule will be posted, as well as the Practice Schedules. It is the responsibility of each competitor, coach and parent to check the Bulletin Board for official information. Any corrections to the schedule or other unique situations will be posted on this board. Skaters must arrive at least 45 minutes prior to their event(s).

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COMPETITION EVENTS AND ELIGIBILITY

Competitors may enter at their free skating level or one level above that for which they are qualified in any event. Competitors may not skate at a level lower than for which they are qualified, nor may they compete in more than one level in each event, with the exception of Short Program, Dance events, Artistic events and Duets. Requirements for Dance are listed below.

Event eligibility is as of April 1, 2011; age restricted events are determined by the skater's age as of April 1, 2011. Competitors must comply with US *Figure Skating* requirements relating to testing and eligibility. Pre Preliminary through PreJuvenile entries will be grouped by age. The Referee reserves the right to combine Teen/Open events with Non Teen/Open events of the same level as well as Young Adult and Adult events, Ladies' and Men's events of the same level to make events.

SHORT PROGRAM –requirements as per the upcoming 2011-2012 competition season. These events are separate events and not combined with Freeskating events. Skaters will be allowed to enter two levels of the short program only—at their current test level and one level higher. Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior competitors, see USFS 2010-11 Rulebook 3640-3672. Juvenile and Open Juvenile Short Programs will be offered and consist of the same requirements as the Intermediate Short Program so that all Juvenile and Open Juvenile competitors will be competing with skaters of the same age and ability.

FREESKATING

WELL-BALANCED COMPETITIVE FREESKATING TRACK

Competition requirements for Pre-Preliminary through Senior Free Skating and Adult Bronze through Adult Masters Free Skating are as set forth in the 2010-11 USFS Rulebook.

Single rotation jumps: salchow, toe loop, and loop only. Jump combinations/sequences with the above jumps are allowed. Maximum 5 jump elements. Connecting steps and movements demonstrated throughout the program. May not have passed higher than USFS Pre-Preliminary free skate test. Time: 1:40 max
Preliminary Test Teen Preliminary Test (13-18)	2 spins of a different nature, combination spins allowed (min 3 revs and no flying spins). Single jumps except Axel. Jump combinations/sequences are allowed. Max 5 jump elements. Connecting steps throughout. Must have passed Pre-Pre free skate, but not higher than Preliminary Free Skate test. Time: 1:30 +/- 10
Pre-Juvenile Test Open Pre-Juv Test (over age 13)	3 spins in any position (min 4 revs), one must be a combination spin with change of foot p[^{top} ma; (min 3 revs on each foot or total of 6 revs) No flying spins. All single jumps except Axel. Jump combinations/sequences allowed. Max 5 jump elements . One step sequence using full ice, straight line, circular or serpentine. Must have passed Preliminary free skate test & no higher than Pre-Juvenile Freeskate test. Time: 2:00 +/- 10
Juvenile Test Open Juvenile Test (age 13+)	3 spins in any position (min 4 revs), one must be a combination spin with one change of foot (min 4 revs on each foot). Flying spins OK. All single jumps including Axel with 5 jump elements max. One step sequence using full ice, straight line, circular or serpentine. Must have passed Pre-Juvenile Freeskate test, but no higher than Juvenile Freeskate test. Time: 2:15 +/- 10
Intermediate Test	3 spins in any position (min 4 revs), one must be a combination spin with at least one change of foot (min 4 revs on each foot). Flying spins OK. Single jumps and only the double Salchow and the double toe loop permitted. Jump combinations/sequences OK. Max 6 jumping elements. One step sequence straight line, circular or serpentine using full ice. Must have passed at least the Juvenile Freeskate test but no higher than the Intermediate Freeskate test. Time: 2:30 +/- 10
Novice Test	3 spins in any position (min 6 revs), one must be a combination with at least one change of foot (min 5 revs on each foot). Flying spins OK. All single jumps and only double Salchow double toe loop and double loop. Combinations/sequences OK. Max 7 jump elements for men, max 6 jump elements for ladies. One step or spiral sequence (see rule 3640 for description. Must have passed Intermediate Freeskate test and not higher than Novice Freeskating test. Time: Ladies 3:00 +/- 10; Men 3:30 +/- 10
Junior Test	3 spins – one must be a flying spin, one a solo spin (min 6 revs each) and a combination spin consisting of all 3 positions and 1 change of foot (min 2 revs in each position min 5 on each foot). All single jumps. Double jumps may only be double salchow, double toe loop, double loop and double flip. Combination/sequences OK. Max 8 jumping elements for Men and 7 for Ladies. 1 step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface. Must have passed the Novice Freeskate test but not higher than the Junior Freeskate test. Time: Ladies 3:30 +/- 10; Men 4:00 +/- 10
Senior Test	3 spins (all solo spins min 6 revs) – one must be a Flying spin, one spin in one position, one combination of all 3 positions and one change of foot (2 revs each position and min 5 on each foot). 4 different double jumps, one must be double Lutz. Combinations/sequences OK. Max 8 jumping elements for Men, 7 for Ladies. Men: 2 different step sequences. Ladies: 1 step sequence and 1 Spiral sequence. Must have passed Junior Freeskate test. Time: Ladies: 4:00 +/- 10; Men: 4:30 +/- 10

COMPULSORY MOVES

Test and age requirements are listed under Freeskating. Additional moves and unnecessary footwork will be penalized. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between jumps. No music. Committee may combine female and male entrants to make events.

Young Adult/Adult Bronze	Flip, combination jump with two single jumps; axel not allowed. Sit spin (min 4 revs), forward spiral (inside or outside) and connecting steps. Time: 1:30 (max). Half ice.
Young Adult/Adult Silver	Lutz, combination jump with two single jumps one of which is a loop. Axel allowed. Camel spin (min 3 revs). Front to back scratch spin with exit on skating foot (min 3 revs per foot). Forward inside spiral or Ina Bauer. Time: 1:30 (max). Full ice.
Young Adult/Adult Gold	Axel, one single/single combination jump. Sit change sit spin (min 4 revs per foot). Layback spin (Ladies) Camel spin (Men) (min 4 revs) Forward spiral, Ina Bauer or spread eagle. Straight line footwork sequence. Time: 1:30 Full ice.

SPINS ONLY EVENT

Entrants qualify according to their Freeskating level. Spins must be skated exactly as stated, but may be performed in any order. Connecting steps are not to be included and will not affect your score. All levels will be skated on 1/2 ice with no music. Committee may combine male and female entrants to make events.

Pre-Preliminary or Adult Pre-Bronze	One foot spin optional free leg (3 revs); two foot spin (3 revs); forward sit spin (3 revs). 1:00 max. Adult Pre-Bronze time is 1:30
Preliminary/ Teen Preliminary Adult Bronze	Forward sit spin (3 revs); Upright scratch spin (5 revs); forward camel spin (3 revs). 1:00 max. Adult Bronze time is 1:30
Pre-Juvenile/ Open Pre-Juvenile Adult Silver	Camel spin (4 revs); change foot sit spin (4 revs each foot); front to back scratch (4 revs each foot). 1:30 max.
Juvenile/ Open Juvenile Adult Gold	Flying camel spin (5 revs), sit spin (5 revs each foot), combination spin with one change of foot and one change of position (4 revs each foot). 1:30 max.
Intermediate	Combination spin consisting of 1 change of foot & one change of position (5 revs each foot). Camel to back camel spin (5 revs per foot). Layback or attitude (ladies); crossfoot spin (men) (5 revs) 1:30 max.
Novice	Combination spin with 1 change of foot and at least 1 change of position (5 revs each foot). Flying spin of choice (6 revs); Spin with 1 position and no change of foot, may commence with a jump (5 revs). Ladies: layback spin (8 revs) Men: crossfoot spin (6 revs). 1:30 max.
Junior	Flying sit spin (8 revs), combination spin with at least 2 changes of position and only 1 change of foot (6 revs each foot & 2 per position), Ladies layback (8 revs), Men: crossfoot spin (8 revs). 1:30 max.
Senior	Flying spin of choice (8 revs); combination spin with at least two changes of position and 1 change of foot (6 revs each foot, 2 revs per position); solo (not combination) spin of skater's choice (8 revs). 1:30 max.

JUMPS ONLY EVENT

Entrants will qualify according to their free skating level. Jumps should be performed exactly as stated. Each skater has the option to attempt each jump twice. If a jump is attempted twice, then only the second attempt will be judged.

Pre-Preliminary	Toe loop; combination of any two single jumps (no axels) ½ ice
Preliminary/Teen Preliminary	Flip or Lutz; combination of any single jump plus a loop jump ½ ice

Juvenile/Open Juvenile	Axel; combination of any double/single combination; connecting steps into a double jump. Full ice
Intermediate	Axel or Double Axel; any single/double or double/double combination Connecting steps into a Double jump. Full ice
Novice	Axel or Double Axel; any double/double or double/triple jump combination; connecting steps into any double or triple jump. Full ice
Junior	Double axel; any double/double, double/triple or triple/triple jump combination; any double or triple flip out of footwork full ice
Senior	Double or triple axel; any double/triple or triple/triple jump combination; any triple or out of footwork

FOOTWORK PROGRAM EVENT

Entrants will be divided by age and/or gender at the discretion of the referee depending upon the number of entrants. Skaters will perform a footwork sequence of their own design to music. Vocal music is allowed. The program should contain a variety of turns and sequences and emphasize the skater's controlled edges and turns in addition to speed and quickness. **Jumps and spins are not allowed. Note: test level is by MIF or Dance**

ARTISTIC FREESKATING

Dramatic and light events will be offered at each level. Emphasis is on artistry rather than athletic ability of the skater. Skaters select their own music and interpret its theme and tempo. Costumes are encouraged, but must comply with costume rules. Vocal music permitted. Props may be placed on the ice during the event. This is a "FUN" event ...we encourage everyone to participate. Committee may combine male and female, dramatic and light events in order to make events. Skaters placing fourth and higher in preliminary and higher artistic solo events, including adult events, will be qualified to enter the next National Showcase. National Showcase contestants must also be qualified by test level. Duets are not required to qualify for National Showcase. Elements	Skating will be judged solely on artistic value. Levels may be combined at the discretion of the Chief Referee to make a competition. Technical skill not marked; however, skating must be the major element of performance.

ARTISTIC FREESKATING-DUETS

No test requirements. Emphasis is on artistry and theater rather than athletic ability of the skaters. Skaters select their own music (vocals allowed). Costumes are encouraged. Only props that are part of the theme and not a safety hazard will be allowed. There must be no debris, live props, fire or water. Any two eligible skaters may enter as a duet: duets may be segregated by the test level of the highest ranked member or combined to make logical events. **Max. 1:40.**

DANCE EVENTS

Each dance will be a separate event. Competitors may enter as many dances as they wish on any level above their test level, but cannot enter below their test level except for the Open Events. Committee may combine male and female, standard, adult and masters entrants in order to make events.

Depending on the number of entries, dance groups may be flighted due to limited ice.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. **All SNOW PLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8** must skate all events at highest level passed and **NO** official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances. **All SNOW PLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8** compete in the same level for Basic Elements, Free Skating and Artistic unless the Referee combines events to make a full event. **For Free Skate 1-6, and Test Track** eligibility will be based only upon highest Free Skate level passed (Moves In the Field test level will not determine skater's competition level). **For Free Skate 1-6, Adult 1-4 and Test Track** skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher in Compulsories BUT not both levels in the same event during Fun Fest.
