2023 Show Participation Rules

(as adopted by the Santa Fe Skating Club Board of Directors August 9, 2023)

Saturday, December 2 at 12:00 PM
“Music Legends”

All Santa Fe Skating Club members are invited to be involved in the Club’s annual show either as a skater or a volunteer. The goals of the production are to provide all members with an opportunity to demonstrate their talents and creativity in a show environment and bring them together to promote figure skating while raising money for the Club.

Please note that the Santa Fe Skating Club Board of Directors may at any time make any changes to these rules necessary to accommodate show requirements, such as show theme or length, which is ideally 90 minutes.

Skaters must be current members of the Santa Fe Skating Club by October 1, 2023 in order for music choices to be held for them. Music choices must be approved by Show Chair Tammy Berendzen at santafeskatingclub@gmail.com before choreography starts. We are limiting show music to two songs per artist/group.

Solos

- To skate a solo, a skater **must have passed their pre-preliminary skating skills test or pre-bronze adult skating skills test by October 20, 2023**
- Questions about testing should be directed to private coaches

Duets/Trios/Small groups

- Must be actual duets, trios, or small groups
- Skater(s) cannot just be in background so that one skater is featured
- Cannot be a string of solo performances
- **Coaches may only skate in one (1) duet, trio, or small group with a student(s)**

Maximum Number of Programs Skater can Skate In

- **Skaters can skate in a maximum of two (2) programs**
- Skaters who are eligible to skate a solo may only skate one solo
- Skaters who each skate a solo cannot join up together to skate a duet together
 - If Alice and Lucy each skate a solo, they cannot skate a duet together; however they can skate a duet with a skater that is not skating a solo; they can also be part of a small or large group number

Eligibility to Skate Solos, Duets, Trios, Quartets

- Other than invited guests, **skaters must be Santa Fe Skating Club members – home or associate by October 1, 2023** – in order to participate in the show

- Skaters who are **enrolled in the Fall 2023 Santa Fe Skating Club Learn to Skate program are eligible to participate in a large group program** without joining the Santa Fe Skating Club
 - Skaters who are Learn to Skate members will need full Club membership to participate in any show program other than a large group program

Time Limits for Show programs

- Length of program should be based on the free skate level of the skater as of October 15, 2023 (what level would they compete at if they were competing in October 2023)
- The length of programs for invited guest performers will be determined by consultation between the guest performer(s) and the Show Chair
- The length of programs for the Club program(s) and Learn to Skate program(s) will be determined by consultation between the coach(es) choreographing the program(s) and the Show Chair

For solos, duets, trios

Snowplow Sam – Basic 6	1:10 max
Pre-Free Skate – Free Skate 6	1:40 max
Adult 1 – 6	1:40 max
Beginner & High Beginner	1:40 max
No Test – Pre-Preliminary	1:40 max
Preliminary – Bronze/Juvenile	2:00 max
Pre-Silver/Intermediate – Silver/Novice	2:10 max
Pre-Gold/Junior	2:30 max
Gold/Senior	2:40 max
Adaptive Pre-Bronze – Adaptive Gold	1:40 max
Adult Pre-Bronze – Adult Gold	1:40 max

For groups that have 4 or more skaters

Program length is to be determined by free skate level of majority of skaters in the group

Snowplow Sam – High Beginner	1:30 max
Adults	1:40 max
Pre-Preliminary and above (skaters must have passed pre-preliminary free skate test)	2:00 max

Note re: Large Group Program(s)

Will be organized through the Club this year.
