

Santa Fe Skating Club **Requirements for Coach Membership**

Pursuant to Section 3.6(i) of the Santa Fe Skating Club By-Laws, Coach Membership in the Santa Fe Skating Club is:

Available to a skating professional who coaches any member of the Santa Fe Skating Club and is in good standing with the Club or any previous skating club in which membership was held. Furthermore the Coach shall meet all coaching requirements established by U.S. Figure Skating and any additional requirements established by the Club. Coach membership shall entitle the person to: membership as a coach in U.S. Figure Skating with SFSC as home club; and to skate and/or coach in all Club sessions, shows, carnivals, and exhibitions. The Club Board of Directors retains the right to revoke coach membership status at any time for failure to be in good standing with the Club.

In addition to the above-stated benefits, Santa Fe Skating Club Coach Members will be listed on the Club's website and bulletin board.

Coach Membership is not intended for those who only teach in the Club's Learn to Skate program.

To be considered a coach in good standing with the Club, a coach must meet the following requirements:

1. Be a member, and maintain membership, in the Santa Fe Skating Club.
2. Be a member, and maintain membership, in U.S. Figure Skating.
3. Complete U.S. Figure Skating coach registration by July 1 of each year.
4. Be in compliance with U.S. Figure Skating's coach compliance requirements as provided in U.S. Figure Skating GR 4.01 (MR 5.11), including, but not limited to, background check and SafeSport Training by July 1 of each year.
5. Maintain personal liability insurance with minimum limits of \$1-million per occurrence and \$5-million aggregate.
6. Be in compliance with U.S. Figure Skating's coach continuing education requirements as they apply to coaching in any U.S. Figure Skating or member club activity as provided in U.S. Figure Skating GR 4.02 (MR 5.12) by July 1 of each year.
7. Abide by all rules, regulations, and professional codes of the Santa Fe Skating Club, U.S. Figure Skating, and the Professional Skaters Association.
8. Currently be allowed to coach, and in good standing, at the Club's home rink, the Genoveva Chavez Community Center, as well as for the previous 12-month period.
9. Coaches who were members of another club for the previous 12-month period, and new coaches, shall submit the following to the Santa Fe Skating Club Board of Directors: a written request; a resume; and the name and contact information for two (2) references. Such coaches must have been in good standing with their previous clubs and their previous home rinks.

The Santa Fe Skating Club Board of Directors retains the right to revoke coach membership status at any time for failure to be in good standing with the Club.
